



Extensive family farm model

- 1. Farmers manage and own over 70% of the land area of Ireland.
- 2. Approx. 140,000 family farms, with an average land holding of 32.5 hectares.
- 3. Predominately extensive grass-based livestock farming system.
- 4. 90% of Utilisable Agricultural Area is permanent grassland and meadows compared with EU average of 31%.
- 5. The average livestock herd per farm is 69 cattle, while the average dairy herd is 83 cows generally low to moderate stocking rates.
- 6. 42% of farms are financially viable.

New Green Architecture CAP 2023 – 2027

Good agricultural and environmental conditions (GAECs).

A minimum of 4% "space for nature".

Landscape features will be paid.

25% of CAP payment conditional environmental actions.

€256 million to increase area under organics to 7.5% or 337,500 ha in 2027.



Take home messages

1. Extensive Farming System

6. New funding structure needed outside of CAP

2. Space for Nature (on average 12-14% of farms)

7. Incentive-based biodiversity policy

3. 33% of farmland in agrienvironmental schemes

- 8. Full engagement with farmers on EU Nature Restoration Law
- 4. Farmers in designated land need to be properly compensated
- 9. Farmers property rights must be respected
- 5. Collaborative approach to nature conservation works best
- 10. There needs to be further engagement between the Citizens Assembly and farmers.
