## Seeking Fairness not Favouritism

Who are the Irish Natura and Hill Farmers Association (INHFA)?

- 1. Set up in 2015-16.
- 2. Represent farmers on hill, designated and environmentally valuable land.
- 3. Nationwide organisation working to highlight the challenges faced by farmers in the more marginalised areas of the country.
- 4. Working for recognition of the environmental good/products of farming as well as the food we produce.

## But what if the policy is poor...

\* '....whatever is required to maintain the area in an eligible state. Existing areas of scrub must be controlled to prevent the further encroachment of briars and other woody species into the parcel. Action must be taken to prevent the development of new scrub. Hedgerows must be maintained to prevent them from expanding into the parcel. Drains must be maintained so that they continue to function and to prevent the development of ineligible wet areas within the parcel'

Department of Agriculture's Land Eligibility Guidelines 2015-2022

\*If the farmer does not comply they lose area = income.



#### **Barriers to Success:**

- Imposition of rules from a distance often with little or no consultation.
- \* INHFA members feel their livelihoods and way of life is being sacrificed for the nations balance sheet
- \* Don't trust policy-makers






#### **New AECM Scheme**
