


- Healthy ocean ecosystems = sustainable fisheries

Issues: Shared Fishing Resource


- BREXIT
 - UK EEZ = c.33% of NEA waters
 - Huge reduction in IE quota
 - Mackerel 26% reduction
 - Dublin Bay Prawns 14% reduction
- Common Fisheries Policy report
- Coastal States
 - Unilateral Quotas
 - Overfishing Norway, Faroes, Iceland
- Sustainable management
 - International issue not just Irish
- Scientific advice
 - Follow it
 - Support and help develop it






Issues cont'd: Spatial Squeeze
