1980s: Elected Student Welfare officers in TCD, UCD and in USI

published information about abortion services for students

1989: Student officers taken to court by the 'SPUC' society

1990s: USI met with distressed students and women, offered support

when they couldn't go elsewhere due to stigma

1992: Lift on ban on information for Irish people about abortion services

2001: USI National policy, representing 354,000 students passed

2006: Reaffirmed position

2009: Reaffirmed position

2016: Passed National 'Students for Choice' Strategy

September 2016: Largest ever student delegation joined

'March for Choice' in Dublin





A note on language

'Pro-Choice': the need to remove the barrier of the 8th Amendment of the Irish Constitution so that Irish people have access to free, safe & legal abortion and reproductive healthcare services and supports

'Anti-Choice': the campaign to ensure Ireland keeps some of the most restrictive abortion measures in the world, restricting bodily autonomy, health decisions and choices

Choice needs to be made available to Irish women, in their own country, and not be forced abroad.
