

Article 41.2 - 'Women in the home clause'



Article 41 - The Family

- 1.1 The State recognises the Family as the natural primary and fundamental unit group of Society, and as a moral institution possessing inalienable and imprescriptible rights, antecedent and superior to all positive law.
- 1.2 The State, therefore, guarantees to protect the Family in its constitution and authority, as the necessary basis of social order and as indispensable to the welfare of the Nation and the State.



Key focus for February meeting

- 'Women in the home' clause:
 - ➤ Keep, Delete, Replace?
- Recognise and protect non marital families?

Aim: to agree Ballot paper for voting in April



What is sequential voting?

- ☐ Sequential voting is where the next vote depends on the outcome of the previous vote.
- ☐ Sequential voting was done by the previous Assembly on the Eighth Amendment.

If a majority votes in favour of Option 1 proceed to Ballot 4A. If a majority votes in favour Option 2 proceed to Ballot 3.

Question 2


If you voted C. to question 1, please choose option A or B below:
