Role of An Garda Síochána



- Our mission is "Keeping People Safe"
- Section 7 Garda Síochána Act, 2005
 - Preserve Peace and public order
 - Protect life and property
 - Prevent crime ... by detecting and investigating it
- We work closely with our health and criminal justice partners, and other stakeholders to reduce harm and ensure safety (health-led approach)


Garda National Drugs & Organised Crime Bureau

- Disrupt, dismantle, and prosecute offenders, and focus on organised crime networks and individuals involved in serious criminal activity
- International cooperation & collaboration
- Liaise with local drug units (Operation TARA An Garda Síochána's coordinated approach to tackling drug related issues impacting on communities throughout Ireland, community focused problem solving).
- National-level community harm prevention (9 May 2015 to 31 May 2023)
 - €336 million worth of drugs did not reach our communities
 - OCGs deprived of €28.4 million in cash, 147 firearms
 - Threat to life operations 80





Drug Supply in Ireland

- Global / international level
 - drug production
 - international trafficking
 - world-wide phenomenon & outreach
- National Level or the 'Middle Market'
 - Importation
 - wholesale distribution
- Local or 'Street' Level
 - Retail distribution
- Possession / Use









Ireland cannot address the drugs issue in isolation



- Drug Trafficking is a priority at European and International level
- 40% of criminal networks operating in the EU are involved in drug trafficking
- 60% of criminal networks operating in the EU use violence



An Garda Síochána's experience with drug-related criminality

- Drug Related Intimidation
